The Grotto consists of five plus acres with lush flowerbeds, numerous shrines, a museum and gift shop. The Grotto is set among meandering paths and crooked bridges, with shady, intimate areas for meditation as well as more formal memorials and open picnic grounds. Totalling one-fifth of a mile, the Wonder Cave is fashioned after the catacombs. **\$3.50/Person (Includes Cave)**
